- **Development**: U14 schools, U13 county, U12, minis, partnerships with and Brentford FC Community Sports Trust and Vidar-Ulkebøl, one of Denmark's best known community HC

VOLUNTEERS:

We rely entirely on volunteers (coaches, assistants, team managers, table officials, referees, etc.) to run the club so we're always on the lookout for individuals ready to contribute their time, passion, and skillset. You make a tangible difference by enabling others to enjoy and develop in the sport of handball, which is really rewarding. We hope you'll also simply enjoy being part of the Eagles family. We expect you to abide by our code of conduct and pay the relevant club fees and we commit to funding your development (coaching / refereeing / table officiating qualifications) subject to your commitment.

PLAYERS:

At the most basic level, we provide you with access to training and competitions in exchange for fees but there is more to being an Eagle. You will grow as a player, you will experience and learn from successes and disappointments, and you will be part of a welcoming family, making friends and having fun in the process. In return, we expect you to be more than a handball 'consumer' and to give back. For seniors, it means being a new player's 'buddy' to help them better integrate, mentoring a junior player, helping at junior training a few times, and watching a few junior home games. For juniors, it means supporting the seniors a few times when they play at home. The more you give, the more you get back. We expect you (and your parents/guardians if you're U18) to abide by the club's code of conduct and pay the relevant club fees.

SPOND:

We use the Spond club management app exclusively for all club matters (training and match schedules, events, communication) and we expect all club members to download the app (spond.com) and use it.

FUNDRAISING:

Affordable player fees are typically insufficient to cover very high hall hire costs hence we critically rely on alternative sources of income to balance our budget and fund development activities. We kindly request club members to support where possible by helping organise fundraisers, applying for grants, seeking sponsorship, donating to the club and using easyfundraising (www.easyfundraising.org.uk), a great way to donate a % of your online shopping spend to the club <u>at no cost or effort to you</u>.

- Be courteous and polite and listen to others.
- Stay in control of our emotions.
- Pay club fees on time (or proactively requesting an extension).
- Discharge your volunteer and/or player duties as set out in the respective sections.
- Report ASAP anything inappropriate to the Safeguarding/Welfare officer (Erika Recska, 07716 019053).
- Turn complaints into requests.

- Accept that athletic contests, including practice sessions are educational experiences and opportunities.
- Be enthusiastic and motivated, encourage and motivate your clubmates.
- Get to know your clubmates and develop a positive relationship with them.
- Enjoy training and enjoy competing with your clubmates.

- Be willing to keep learning and learn from your mistakes, strive for improvement, and see every challenge as an opportunity.
- Lead by example and make those around you better.
- Stay humble.
- Show courage in adversity.
- Give your all, no matter the score.
- Be resilient, never give up, get up one more time than you have been knocked down.
- Put the success of the team above individual achievement.
- Be proactive in utilising your personalised skills / work connections to better the club and its members.
